NEW ISSUE**Imperial Drive Speeding**

Council had received an e-mail from Richard Sargent requesting a stop sign be put in on Imperial Drive. Hogan said we cannot just put a stop sign in. Chief Murphy said he has assigned COPS to patrol the area and cruisers are also keeping a close eye on it. When the radar monitor board comes in he will put it on Imperial; cannot use stop sign as a speed control devise.

Hogan said this is a city wide problem. Chief said neighbors can watch for license plate and then let him know; many times it is someone from the neighborhood. Chief has had officer go to a house after know license plate and warn them; many times they are totally oblivious to what they are doing.

Angelou thanked Sargent for the e-mail. Sargent said he does not think the radar monitor will do any good; their speedometer tells them what speed they are going. Council members assured him that the radar monitor is very effective because people see in big bold numbers how fast they are going. Hogan said we put the radar monitor on Chapelfield and it really slowed down traffic there. Chief will continue to study this.

Creekside Safety

Hogan said the opening of Creekside was wonderful and thanked all the volunteers. Many safety issues have surfaced since the opening. He would request Council members put these concerns in writing and submit them to White. Mitchell said we are going to put gravel in the six foot area and take it to three foot; will also post "No Diving"; will address questions of skate boards, bicycles, and other issues that have been raised.
