ISSUES:

Aggregation - Electric Utility Deregulation Options

Kevin Maynard, AMP Ohio gave a presentation focusing on Local Government Opportunities in a Restructured Energy Industry, explaining what deregulation is doing and opportunities that are now available. (Information from the presentation is available in the Council Office.) Maynard also provided sample ordinance language. Everyone thanked Maynard for the presentation.

Council discussed the need to move immediately to pass legislation to effect a government electricity aggregation; Opt-In and Opt-Out. Opt-Out has to be a ballot issue and if passed, then the City notifies customers that they will be automatically enrolled, but they still will have the right to opt out of the program if they want. Waiver of second reading and emergency language is necessary to pass this at the next Council meeting (August 21st) since the Board of Elections must receive any November ballot issues by August 25 at 4:00 p.m.

Council agreed to proceed with legislation for Opt-Out Aggregation.

Recommendation: 1st Reading, Waiver of second, Emergency, Consent.

AL GROVES

Groves said he worked with ODOT today, and things went very well; interesting and productive. There was a concern that ODOT would have a problem with going under Mill Street, but ODOT did not protest it, as long as we meet their standards. They discussed the flood wall, and even though the study is not quite complete, we can do the flood wall and meet FEMA requirements. Groves discussed elevations in the general area and the flood gate, and the need to raise Mill Street up to 800 ft.; and said we can do that.

Groves continued that they have determined that the parking lot as proposed would have too large a footprint. He met with parking consultants this afternoon and they agreed that perhaps a parking structure for approximately 400 automobiles to begin with would be the best way to go; with more parking coming in a future stage. They agreed that the parking garage should be constructed so that you see only the entrance to the parking garage at street level; not have ramp system on the exterior walls; work around the plaza. When the Planning Commission makes their recommendation and Council adopts we will be able to move forward quickly. Groves also presented pictures of various parking garages around the country that would be good models. Groves said it has been a good day and we are moving in a positive direction.
