Proclamation

January 2022

WHEREAS: The United States Congress designated January as Cervical Health Awareness Month; and

WHEREAS: It is estimated that more than 14,500 new cases of cervical cancer will be diagnosed in American women this year; and

WHEREAS: Over 4,200 women will die from cervical cancer this year; and

WHEREAS: Cervical cancer most often affects women in the prime of life; and

WHEREAS: Regular cervical cancer screening tests are effective in detecting the disease early when it can be successfully treated; and

WHEREAS: Cervical cancer vaccines and screening tests provide a formidable and effective means of preventing this disease; and

WHEREAS: Highlighting issues related to cervical cancer, HPV disease and the importance of early detection, and increasing awareness among patients and healthcare providers alike regarding the best use of these preventative tools is a key component in safeguarding women's health.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Laurie A. Jadwin, Mayor of the City of Gahanna, Ohio, encourage our citizens to recognize that cervical cancer is preventable, and to encourage and support the women in our lives in taking charge of their health and availing themselves of the tests and vaccines that have proven effective in preventing cervical cancer, and do hereby do proclaim
