A. CALL TO ORDER - Invocation, Pledge of Allegiance, Roll Call

Gahanna City Council met in Regular Session on Monday, August 20, 2001 in Council Chambers of City Hall, 200 S. Hamilton Road, Gahanna, Ohio. President of Council Rebecca Stinchcomb called the meeting to order at 7:40 p.m. Council Vice President Mike O'Brien gave the invocation followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. led by Chief of Police Dennis Murphy.

B. ADDITIONS OR CORRECTIONS TO THE AGENDA:

MOTION by O'Brien, seconded by Kneeland, to add MR-0057-2001 regarding a court computer to the agenda under Correspondence and Actions. ROLL CALL: Voting yes: O'Brien, Kneeland, Hogan, Payne, Shepherd, Stinchcomb, Angelou. Motion carried.

C. HEARING OF VISITORS:

Windy McKenna, Gahanna Jefferson School Board, stated it has been a busy summer; freshman orientation is this evening; at the July Board meeting we honored Mary Otting for an award of merit received; also approved agreement with YWCA Kid Scape program at all schools; at the August meeting we approved several contracts; also approved bus routes.

Frank Summerfield, Jr., 20 E. Maple Street, North Lewisburg, OH, stated he was here representing his parents; do have power of attorney; both have been in bad health; we are also trying to empty the building; have worked every weekend since closing; but we still have things in there; had planned to have everything out; talked to brother and he box rest and have everything out by Labor Day weekend. McGregor stated that we take possession at noon tomorrow; need to have everything out; there is a liability problem; also is a purchase problem as we paid a premium for this date; beyond this feel they would have to pay us back. Summerfield stated he is willing to talk to my attorney tomorrow morning; was not available today. McGregor reiterated that we will be taking possession at noon tomorrow.

Angelou asked if we did not have a contract with date specific. McGregor stated we did and that we paid a premium for this date; we gave them the significant amount of \$5,000 for moving expenses and it has been 60 days since closing instead of the normal 30 days; a business, we will share with you later this evening, is anxious to get in and get to work so they can make a more exacting presentation and update their architectural plans; everything they have done to date has been done from the outside.

O'Brien asked if it would be possible to move their things to be safe from the elements. McGregor stated we won't take them out; but there will be people in and out of there; we won't be inventorying; we don't want what's in there; if boxed by noon tomorrow, they can leave it there but we will be in and out; don't think we can do anything else. McGregor continued that we won't haul it out and throw it away; we will get the locks changed; if boxed by then they can come back on a Saturday and pick it up; we've all moved; you have a date you have to be out there; is they want us to let them back in for a couple of hours next Saturday, we can work with that; is not in our interest to haul everything out of there; we do have a police auction coming up September 8 and we will get out of there what is left and put in the auction if not completely cleaned out by next weekend.

Payne stated she had seen no activity on moving until this week; we do have a contract; but nothing happened for those 60 days until last week; don't think they could box it up in a couple of hours; we had a contract and is cost us \$5,000 extra.

Angelou stated we do have a client that is interested; is exactly what we want to happen; private enterprise is coming in and turn that corner into a business; if we didn't have anything in the offing for the next few months that would be a different situation; but this is exactly what we want to happen. McGregor stated the developer is willing and very anxious to get in; CIC will hear presentation tomorrow; will be quite a procedure and there is no guarantee at the end. Angelou stated there was also no offer of paying rent. Weber stated that implied rent should be paid at the least.

Joe Kolar, 1215 Rice Avenue, stated he just wanted to say thank you on the issue of the Rice Avenue pond; stepped up to the plate; responded very well; opened up the lines of communication; are working with Parks and Recreation to get a schedule in place; just wanted to tell you thank you very much.

Ramin Dowlati, 1085 Ashmead Dr., stated he wished to address two issues; one is to express concern about Creekside development as discussed in the paper; concerned with funds going to an ice skating facility with the presence of a facility less than 10 minutes away; feel that is more than sufficient; second issue is bicycle paths in this City; drive on Havens Corner; there are signs that say we are a bicycle friendly community; couldn't pick a worse road to put that sign on; would like to know what are we doing to make this community bicycle friendly. McGregor stated that once you are in corporate limits there are sidewalks on Havens Corners; don't like to bicycle on sidewalks but on Havens Corners it is permissible in our bike trail system; was designed and designate so children from all neighborhoods can get around the city; every new street is done with two standard specs that serious bicyclers want; they don't want bike lanes because they become littered with debris; endanger cyclists with debris that accumulates in bike lanes; we are one of the first communities to address these issues; since 1980 we have put handicapped ramps in every rebuild project; we have safe bike paths like at the Swim and Racquet Club and Stoneridge; have a police program in place that rewards children randomly when they see kids wearing bike helmets; give them Dairy Queen certificates; are making big strides but have a long way to go; have foot bridges around Big Walnut and adding the low water pedestrian crossing; have a Bicycle Advisory Board which includes Jefferson Township and they give us advise; when we are doing new roads we make them more bicycle friendly; am pleased with the progress we have made; there is available to you a path through Gahanna Woods and Farm Creek that is back in the neighborhoods; have a brochure which shows you the connectors; is a safe way to come in to town. Payne stated that the north side of Havens Corners is in Jefferson Township and we can't improve that part of the road; may want to speak to them also. Angelou asked if we could share our bicycle master plan; is very detailed and provides quite a bit of information.

O'Brien stated that on the ice skating part of the comments, would like to make it clear to everyone that it has not been the intention of the administration or this Council to build an ice skating facility; not ever been discussed; what we hope to do is have an extended water feature; if engineering comes back and input so indicates, then there will be another water feature; in discussions about 5 years ago public input talked about the possibility of extending the water feature with cooling coils to freeze the water feature for casual skating; no more than being able to ice skate in a safe place; can't do that today; don't believe any one of us have talked about building an ice skating facility.

McGregor stated that most all of our commissions, except Bicycle Advisory, are specific

and enacted by ordinance; the Bicycle Advisory Board is made of a working relationship with township and if you would like to serve would be pleased to have you on that board.

Hogan stated he took exception to what O'Brien stated; did send Dowlati an E-mail that says we were looking at ice skating and read from E-mail; this Council has talked about it on numerous occasions; on June 18, 2001 when we contracted with Stilson, Angelou says we will be adding ice skating; also like to refer to the City of Gahanna preliminary Phase 2 cost estimate; cost estimate includes ice sheet equipment of \$350,000; includes \$15,000 for Zamboni; even \$14,000 for a Zamboni garage; it has been talked about and public needs to get involved; can't sit and listen. Shepherd stated we are building a water feature; we discussed a water feature; at that time we decided why not investigate for more usage; we investigated, we are not building an ice skating facility; we are building a water feature; that came form citizens of Gahanna.

Stinchcomb stated we don't want to get into a debate under Hearing of Visitors but want to correct another misconception; the President of Council sits on the Development team; is a monthly meeting of Mayor's administrative staff where Creekside is discussed; throughout the year have attended this meeting; one of the comments banted around incorrectly is that this Council does not want to have public meetings and won't have them; is time to correct that misconception; that has never been the case; since we put out information and put out requests for proposal that competed on the engineering contract, it has been said that public meetings will be held when we are ready; when Stilson has completed its study, when physical models are available for viewing, when engineering details regarding an ice skating area are available, then at that time it is appropriate; will do when it is appropriate and not because there is an election; when I collected signatures for my petition found that there were a lot of misconceptions out there; had old physical models and drawings at last meetings; had current boards up at Creekside Festival; we will work to correct those when we have Stilson report back; when we have physical models and drawings and updated information we will have public input; wanted to make that clarification; that's why election season is often called the crazy season.

Mayor:

McGregor stated he wished to share some artist's renderings for the Summerfield property; wanted to share with you as soon as we received them. White stated there are several elevations; the area known as the gun shop would be razed except for the foundation; Summerfield's would remain intact; would be jacked up about 3 feet to be above flood level; will note on the east elevation that there is no entrance in the front; the sidewalk is narrow and it was felt the having people enter at the corner may not work well; other interesting thing is there is an opening to allow people to go to the rear of the Creekside; this is what we want to do; draw people to the creek between the two buildings and an open kind of patio area; this will be the Old Bag of Nails restaurant; both buildings will have the entry to the rear or side; will have an English pub theme; did some studying and most held 30 people and were narrow and long buildings; this will hold about 60 people; he has 4 establishments in greater Columbus; once you traverse a couple of steps there is a deck area which will overlook the creek; next elevation is what you see from west side; may be offices above; could go up stair case and on another balcony level; wall element begins to give us a flavor to what to expect; also how we might separate the pier deck area with the next lower level; one thing I like is that from Mill Street this entrance allows you to go through the southern part of 57 and then enter the boardwalk; this whole are is considered public area; talks about their building it and proposing for the Summerfield building to basically look at smaller uses, maybe 3 or 4 smaller uses; could put space for ice cream store; another coffee shop wants to come; another option would be the CVB or Chamber; see it as a multi use facility; this seems to be a proposal we think we will be able to work out; has captured development standards and guidelines we have been working on; think this begins to epitomize all our work; shows that we can in fact attract public private partnerships, if, in fact, we aggregate and have design and concept for them to follow.

Hogan stated that prior to the meeting tonight there was a very nice ceremony on the dedication of the police building to Roger Schirtzinger; I knew a kind and gentle man; glad we did what we did; on the Stilson study after 4 parts we get it all; parts 5 though 9 have to do with construction; whenever data is complete that's when I would like to have public meetings; tonight we approved the minutes; feel it is an appropriate time to do it.

Shepherd stated that once we get the report it is appropriate for public meetings; don't need to hold public meetings on items we have had to date.

Payne announced she has a new grandson.

Angelou stated she was happy to be back; took a vacation to celebrate 35th wedding anniversary; is exciting to have some potential plans here for the Summerfield building; this is the type of thing we had hoped with our investment would lead private enterprise to come in; looks like that may be successful; incredible rendering; thank you for sharing this tonight.

O'Brien congratulated Sam Jr. and Carrie Payne on birth of Zachary Michael; can't think of anything else; lot of time there are things I would like to say; would only add credibility to some things that were meant to confuse and meant to be inaccurate; that's all I have.

Shepherd stated that the Lansdowne rebuild went beautifully; appeared to be a success; everyone seems to be happy.
