### Gahanna City Council Safety Committee Meeting

Fire Division Briefing – June 27, 2016

#### **Operational Updates**

- Emergency response runs include 4,045 EMS incidents and 758 fire related incidents totaling 4,803 runs through May 31, 2016. This averages 31 runs per 24-hour shift or 1.30 incidents per hour.
- Emergency response runs for **May, 2016** included 876 EMS incidents, of which 119 involved motor vehicle accidents (34 on the freeway) and 10 non-breather/cardiac arrests. There were 142 Fire (non-EMS) incidents for a monthly total of 1018 emergency incidents.
- Special event at Creekside (Blues and Jazz festival) generated slightly more EMS incidents than in 2015 (more than a dozen EMS incidents were managed, several serious in nature that required transport to a local ED).
  - 1. Fire Division statutory response and event planning has been completed for the July 4<sup>th</sup> Fireworks.
- Reminder to residents that extreme weather conditions such as rain and flooding, lightening/high winds can affect our community at anytime and that preparation for power outages, water damage and downed trees are important. FCEMA and FEMA have online resources related to preparing for severe weather. Mifflin Fire is also available to address specific concerns or questions for residents.
  - 1. A formal request was made on 6/22 to activate the Gahanna EOC (standby mode) in anticipation of severe weather/storm event that occurred on June 22<sup>nd</sup> for approximately 24-hours.
- This is also the season for heat-related illnesses, outside recreational and pedestrian/cyclist injuries and incidents. Residents should be mindful of sharing the road with cyclists, parents should wear and require their children to wear bike helmets and all citizens are reminded to hydrate and use extra caution when enjoying the outdoors.



#### **Administrative Updates**

- A full-time firefighter test is underway to establish an eligibility list. The Fire Division anticipates hiring 9 full-time firefighters on July 19<sup>th</sup>. Probationary firefighters require 120 -180 days to complete orientation. Firefighters are expected to be assigned to fire stations by December 31<sup>st</sup>.
- 2017 operating budgets have been submitted to the Board of Trustees for 2017 and are under review. The Fire Division is presently operating within budget and expects to complete the 2016 budget year as scheduled.





A severe weather event is expected to impace the Central Ohio region and Metro Columbus late in the evening on 22 June 2016 and last into the early morning on 23 June 2016. The National Weather Service Storm Prediction Center (NWSSPC) estimates winds approaching 75 mph will affect the area as a strong front moves across the region. Expected timeframe of the greatest impact to the area will be 2200-0400.
