# • Transportation & Mobility

- o Register for the Transportation Innovation Forum: *Smart Moves, Efficient Solutions* on Wednesday, June 4, from 12:00 to 4:30 p.m. The forum will focus on innovation in the public sector, supply chain and freight, and transit. Transportation professionals and community leaders will explore forward-thinking, efficient solutions for the region. Register today.
- o Active Transportation: MORPC led sessions at the Ohio Active Transportation Conference and is prepping for the 2025 APBP Virtual Summit.
- o Transportation Safety: Co-hosted a traffic safety equity workshop with OSU and Columbus at the Safe Mobility Conference.
- o GOhio Commute & Mobility: New rideshare app launches in May 2025, with bike-to-work events, new vanpools, and platform upgrades for GOhio Mobility. Groveport received an accessible vehicle via FTA 5310.
- o Passenger Rail: Central Ohio leaders visited Texas; Corridor ID Program, may advance to Step 2 this summer.
- o Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP): Work began on 2025 MTP Report Card tools.
- o Transportation Improvement Program (TIP): Final TIP aligns with MTP; public comment closed with no changes.
- o Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC): Approved final project funding list.
- o LinkUS: Finalizing transit infrastructure funding agreements with COTA and partners.

#### Planning & Development

- o Technical Assistance: Provided targeted support to Grove City, Gahanna, Hilliard, and Galena.
- o Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS): Presented bylaws for proposed Economic Development District.
- o Regional Housing Strategy: Ongoing community workshops and challenge identification.
- o Community-Based Planning (CBPA): Local planning support available; also offering consultant pool, RFP assistance, and staff planners.
- o Planner Pool & Consultant Support: Provides zoning, comp plans, public engagement, feasibility studies, and more.

#### Infrastructure & Funding

- o Register for Securing Our Energy Future: Planning for a High Demand Future. As part of a new four-part energy forum series, MORPC is bringing together Central Ohio's top energy, regulatory, and economic development experts to help local governments and community leaders navigate the region's evolving energy landscape. - o MORPC-Attributable Funding: Developed a survey to guide policy updates.

- o Federal & State Grants: SS4A application for CORPO in development; Brownfield funding application submitted.
- o Ohio Public Works Commission: District 3 discussed SFY 2027 funding updates.
- o Clean Ohio Conservation & Greenspace Funds: \$4.5M (District 3) and \$2.5M (District 17) available; applications due June–September 2025.
- o Money Mondays Series: April topics included grants, state budgets, and banking. May topics: Clean Ohio Fund, federal priorities, and USDA loan programs.

- o 208 Areawide Water Planning: MORPC advancing toward EPA designation with emphasis on engagement.
- o Regional Water Study: Dashboard launched; May workshop planned with Ohio EPA.
- o Regional Water Advisory Council: First meeting held to prioritize rural/agricultural outreach.
- o Sustainability Advisory Committee (SAC): RSA Subcommittee shared strategies and survey; SAC meets in June.
- o Sustainable 2050: Welcomed Plain Township; forum planned May 22, 2025.
- o Energy & Air Quality: Upcoming meetings and "Securing Our Energy Future" forum launch; recent air quality webinar hosted.
- o Neighborhood Air Monitoring Project: Public education and outreach underway.
