**ISSUES - From Chief of Police**

**1. Municipal Fire Safety Inspectors Appointments**

Chief said it is an annual charter requirement that the Director of Public Safety appoint Municipal Fire Safety Inspectors; Tim Taylor from Mifflin Township and Crystal Dickerson from Jefferson Township; requesting legislation to confirm appointment.

**ISSUES - From Director of Public Service**

**1. Speedway LLC SuperFleet Program Agreement**

Franey stated in 2011 when the decision was made to remove fuel site to free land for future development, we went with SuperFleet for fuel purchase; the deal they cut us was \$0.05 off pump price; regional partnerships were in development; we ended up in some procurement committees; found City of Columbus also used SuperFleet; their agreement was \$0.03 on top of wholesale price; we were able to join in that; nothing was signed at the time; SuperFleet has come back and asked that we sign a document; no change to us at all; can put termination in writing with 30 day notice; no risk at all. Larick asked how this pricing compared to when we had our facility. Franey stated we leased our facility to someone who managed it; they charged us the wholesale price plus a markup; thought it was about \$0.03 price but could be wrong; we tacked on a slight amount to help pay back the construction of the facility; fairly similar; was open to public. Larick stated from an ongoing standpoint; would be upkeep and overhead.

Franey confirmed that, taking on regulations, testing and overhead. Leeseberg asked what schools do for fuel. Franey stated they used to come to our facility; believe they are bringing in fuel trucks for the buses.

Angelou asked for salt update. Franey said they have gotten to about 80% of roads; salt bin is empty; our trucks are full; Davies from City of Columbus has let us get some; Columbus is now getting concerned about their supply; our vendor has promised 225 tons delivered this week; hope to have that when it starts to warm up enough where salt will work; have been using brine; use it with salt to extend it; always use it with the salt; cost so far is for about 19 overtime events; costs have been about \$157,000 with salt, brine and overtime. Franey stated 225 tons is half of what he ordered; he ordered 500, they brought him 50; not bringing out full orders; they are having trouble getting salt to municipalities; they are claiming weather issues, multiple problems; used 2500 tons of rock salt this season; have not been using it on residential. Angelou stated think people are being very understanding. Holdren stated at least 50 tons per event are necessary. Angelou asked about storage. Franey stated you can store it.
