
The following report provides an overview of performance data compiled by the Division of Police for April, 2017.

Emergency Communications:

- → Dispatchers handled 426 9-1-1 calls throughout the month. The average call answer delay was maintained at three seconds per call.
- → 20% of all 9-1-1 calls were received from residential, land-line telephones.
- → The Division responded to 2,625 calls for service in April.

Patrol Operations:

- → 181 offense and arrest reports were generated including the following incidents by type:
 - o 2 Burglaries.
 - 1 Breaking and Entering offense.
 - 15 criminal damaging/vandalism incidents.
 - o 10 assaults.
 - 2 of which were felony assaults.
 - o 31 domestic-related responses to include:
 - 23 documented disputes that did not involve a criminal offense.
 - 6 incidents in which arrests were affected.
 - 3 confirmed overdose responses (none fatal); 2 suspected overdose incidents involved prescription medications.
- → The Division affected 7 narcotics-related arrests including:
 - 4 Drug/narcotics offenses (possession, trafficking, etc.).
 - o 3 Drug equipment violations.
- → The Division responded to 62 motor vehicle crashes (total includes State reportable and non-reportable events) with a further breakdown as follows:
 - o 52 were classified as property damage only (PDO) or 83.87% of all responses.
 - o 10 crashes involved injuries or 16.13% of all responses.
 - o 0 traffic fatalities occurred 28 fatality-free months.
 - o 10 crashes occurred on IR-270 16.13% of all crash responses in Gahanna.
 - 3 crashes involved alcohol and/or drug impairment 4.84% of crashes involved an impaired driver.
 - o 1 crash occurred within the Hamilton Road roundabouts 1.61% of all crash responses.
 - Motor vehicle crashes have decreased 18.22% from 2016.
- → Patrol officers affected 9 arrests for impaired driving (OVI). One arrestee returned with a blood alcohol content of .254 or over three times the legal limit of intoxication.
 - 4 of the arrestees refused to submit to chemical testing.



→ The Division responded to 144 alarm calls in April. Of those responses, five were the result of severe weather. A total of \$4,550 in false alarm billing occurred during the month.

Detective Bureau:

- → The Division's detectives were assigned 77 offense and arrest reports requiring investigative follow-up or other administrative action.
- → The detectives obtained and executed 7 search warrants during the month of April.
