Dear Mr. Spence,

This letter will be considered our letter of understanding, effective January 1, 2012 to extend through December 2012. If there are any provisions that are unacceptable, please feel free to notify me.

Rockwood Dry Cleaners agrees to clean and press up to 10 work related items per week, for all full time employees of the Gahanna Police Department. We will also clean all blankets jumpsuits used in the jail. Reserve officer uniforms will be cleaned at a cost of \$3.00 per shirt and \$3.00 per slack to be paid by the reserve officer.

I would like to request that we have two days to clean the items brought in to be cleaned.

Exclusions to this contract include leather and suede garments or jackets, which will be cleaned at regular price.

Any minor repairs such as retaking a hem, replacing buttons, re-stitching patches, will be completed at no additional charge.

The Gahanna Police Department agrees to pay Rockwood Dry Cleaners \$1600 per month upon receipt of an invoice for the cleaning services rendered at the end of each month for the contract year 2012.

Major alterations such as tapering shirts or shortening slacks will be charged and billed separately by our in house seamstress. Rockwood Dry Cleaners currently charges our retail customers \$16.00 to shorten slacks and \$22.00 to taper shirts. The charge to the Gahanna Police Department will be \$6.00 per item altered. These prices represent our seamstress's cost to alter the items.

Each officer who utilizes our alteration department will be given an invoice for the alteration and additional copies will be sent to the Gahanna Police Department at the end of each month. These copies will reflect each alteration completed.

### **Attachment 1**

**21.7. Dry Cleaning.** Members shall be entitled to have their uniforms dry cleaned. Each member may have no more than ten (10) uniform items cleaned each week, at no cost to the member. Uniform items for nonuniformed members shall be defined as items of regular work clothing. The City shall designate the dry cleaning service where uniforms are to be cleaned for the provision of such services.
