AN ORDINANCE TO CREATE SECTION 103.02 OF THE  
CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF GAHANNA, OHIO  
ADOPTING AN OFFICIAL CITY FLAG

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus, through Mayor Dana Rinehart's office, has requested a flag from all suburban communities to display in his office; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gahanna designed and dedicated a centennial flag in 1981; and

WHEREAS, the flag has flown in the City since that time; and

WHEREAS, many people in the community feel that the centennial flag is the official city flag.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GAHANNA, STATE OF OHIO:


Section 1. That Section 103.02 of the Codified Ordinances of Gahanna, Ohio be created, as follows:

**103.02 OFFICIAL CITY FLAG.**


- (a) There is hereby adopted an official city flag of the City of Gahanna.
- (b) The flag of the City is blue with three white stars. The three stars are from the official corporate seal and have been integrated into one representing "Three in One".

Section 2. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect at the earliest period allowed by law.




