COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM UPDATE

MARCH 9, 2026

Program Overview

- Four rounds of funding provided
 - 2023: \$50,000
 - 2024: \$100,000
 - 2025: \$100,000
 - Round 1: \$81,250
 - Round 2: \$18,000
 - 2026: \$100,000 (Go-Live on 3/16/26)
- 43 funded programs/projects
- 25 individual non-profits have received funding

Changes to the 2026 Program

- Expansion of guidelines to make the application process clearer.
- Voluntary information session to be held during the application period to answer applicant questions.
- Addition of a preliminary eligibility review to reduce burden on the Grant Review Committee.
- Additional use of OpenGov to streamline application process.

Priorities and Requirements

- Program Priorities:
 - 1(a): Basic human necessities, including but not limited to, the provision of food and/or clothing to those in need.
 - 1(b): Mental health services and/or community counseling to assist people with mental or social health issues.
 - 2: General safety, health and welfare, including but not limited to transportation, housing, utilities, etc.
 - 3: General improvement of the Gahanna Community.
- Grants will be awarded up to \$10,000

Review Process:

- The Department of Administrative Services conducts an initial eligibility review of the following criteria:
 - Is the applicant's organization an IRS-registered non-profit located in the Gahanna Community?
 - Does the program impact a population of which a minimum of 51% are from the Gahanna Community?
 - If the applicant has received an award in the past, is the previous grant(s) closed?
 - Has all required documentation been submitted?
- Following the initial eligibility review, eligible applications are reviewed by Grant Review Committee (GRC).

Review Process Cont'd:

- The GRC is composed of five members:
 - Two Council appointees
 - Two Mayor appointees
 - One City staff member
- The GRC evaluates applications based on the program priorities, guidelines, and requirements.
- The GRC then recommends a full award, partial award, or no award.
- DAS administers the award and post award processes.

Timeline

- March 16, 2026: Notice of Funding Opportunity sent to local non-profits, application portal opens. Promotion on social media and in newsletter.
- March 24, 2026: Virtual information session held.
 - Option for a second information session, pending demand
- April 6, 2026: Final reminder of funding opportunity sent to local non-profits.
- April 13, 2026: Applications due, portal closes.
- Notices issued by April 23, 2026.

Reporting:

- Two update reports are required throughout the grant period.
- A final report is due at the completion of the program or at the completion of the grant period.
- Reimbursement request form is submitted after expenses have been incurred so grantees can receive payment.
