

929.12 WATER RATES.

- (a) The following rates shall apply to water service within the City:
 (1) Commodity rate. In accordance with Reference Table 10, page 25, of the Water Rate Study, the rates for water supplied through meters to consumers within the corporate limits shall be as shown below:

(b) The Water Improvement Fund Number 1, created pursuant to Ordinance No. 48-63, shall be used for the retirement of bonds and notes issued for the purpose of financing water system capital improvements, and no moneys therein shall be used for any other purpose until and unless the Finance Director of the City of Gahanna certifies that there is sufficient moneys within the fund to make all payments necessary to retire the bonds and notes. In the event the Finance Director so certifies, then the excess funds may be used for capital improvements and maintenance of the water system.

Once the Finance Director certifies that bonds and notes have been retired, the remaining moneys within the fund, if any, shall be transferred to the General Water Fund.

(c) Quarters shall consist of three-month periods with billings commencing on a schedule to be determined by the Director of Public Service. The quarter bill, including interest and all penalties, shall be due and payable thirty days from the date of mailing. A ten percent (10%) penalty shall be assessed to all account payments received after the due date. A final notice granting an additional fourteen days before discontinuance of service shall be mailed to those accounts not paid in the thirty day period.

(d) Bills will be rendered at the address given by the owner, who shall be responsible for promptly notifying the Division of Water of any change of address, and no consideration shall be given for failure to so do.

(e) The Director of Public Service shall review these water rates annually and shall submit a written report to Council by March 1, recommending either that this rate schedule be maintained or modified.
