- Jessica Kuenzli Joins MORPC

MORPC recently welcomed a new addition to the team - Jessica Kuenzli, who is MORPC's new Chief Regional Planning Officer and Senior Director of Planning. She joins MORPC from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency, where she served as Deputy Director of Business and Regulatory Affairs.

- MORPC Convenes Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS) Committee
 On August 22, MORPC convened the first CEDS Committee Meeting. The Committee is comprised
 of 32 individuals from the public and private sectors that represent the main economic interests of
 the region. In addition to assisting with the creation of the region's next CEDS, the committee will
 advise MORPC's Economic Development District Board on activities, funding opportunities, and
 strategies related to implementation of the CEDS.
- MORPC Receives \$70,000 Economic Development Administration (EDA) Grant Award

In July, MORPC received a grant award from the EDA to perform work related to the Economic Development District. This award will allow MORPC to pursue activities related to the implementation of the CEDS priorities: 1) boosting labor force participation, 2) preparing communities for growth, and 3) improving regional alignment on infrastructure development.

• Community Spotlight

In August, the State of Ohio announced \$106.9 million in state support to help assess and remediate 61 hazardous brownfield sites in 22 counties. The Ohio Brownfield Remediation Program helps communities redevelop underutilized properties into valuable economic and community assets. Four counties in Central Ohio received support: Marion, Delaware, Franklin, and Fairfield. Planned end uses for the remediated sites include a coffee shop and charcuterie board prep kitchen, baseball and soccer fields, mixed use buildings, light industrial, affordable housing, and a food hall. MORPC Grant of the Month

Bridge Investment Program

- Department: U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration
- Award size: \$50,000 \$80,000,000
- Applications due November 1st for projects
- Eligible applicants: States, metropolitan planning organizations serving urbanized areas over 200,000 people, local governments, political subdivisions, special purpose districts
- Eligible projects: Bridge construction

Build to Scale

- Department: U.S. Department of Commerce Economic Development Administration
- Available Funding: \$50 million available, award ceiling is \$5 million
- Application Deadline: October 28, 2024
- Eligible Applicants: Local government, state, institutions of higher education, nonprofits
- Eligible Projects: operational and programmatic activities to build public and private capacity for entrepreneurs and innovators, accelerate the growth of regional economies, empower communities to provide proof-of-concept and commercialization assistance, equitably and inclusively increase access to capital

Rural Housing Site Loans

- Department: U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development
- Application Deadline: Rolling
- Available Funding: 5 Year loan with 3%, or below market rate, interest rate
- Eligible Applicants: Public and private nonprofits
- eligible projects: site acquisition and development

Recycle Ohio

- Department: Ohio Environmental Protection Agency
- Available Funding: Awards will range from \$10,000 \$300,000
- Application Deadline: December 6, 2024
- Eligible Applicants: Ohio schools, local government, heath departments, municipal corporations, non-profits, park districts, private sector businesses, solid waste management authorities, state agencies
- Eligible Projects: Initiate or expand recycling programs, encourage sustainable practices, stimulate economic growth, support litter prevention efforts

Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities: Section 5310

- Department: Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC)
- Available Funding: \$1,584,297 in award funds
- Application Deadline: October 25, 2024
- Eligible Applicants: Private non-profit organization, state and local government authorities, public or private operators of public transportation
- Service area must be primarily within the Columbus urbanized area
- eligible projects
- Traditional: Van and bus purchases, wheelchair lifts, wheelchair ramps and securement devices, Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS) for transit, mobility management programs, acquisition of transportation services under a contract or lease, preventive maintenance, radios and communication equipment, purchase and installation of passenger amenities
- Non-Traditional: Travel training, building an accessible path to a bus stop, improving signage or way-finding technology, mobility managements programs

Local and Regional Project Assistance Grants (RAISE)

- Department: U.S. Department of Transportation Office of the Secretary
- Prospective Announcement: November 2024
- Eligible Applicants: Local government, states, transit agency, port authority, special district government
- Eligible Projects: Surface transportation improvements, safety improvements, increasing economic strength and global competitiveness, equitable transportation development and planning, sustainable transportation development

October Legislative Update:

As lawmakers enter the final push of the November election, Congress acts to keep the federal government open through mid-December. Meanwhile, federal legislation to accelerate semiconductor production is signed into law and state lawmakers mull re-regulation of Ohio's electric utilities. Bills to Watch:

- House Bill 2 One-Time Strategic Community Investment Fund (OTSCIF) Makes capital appropriations for FY 2025-2026 from state bond funds and the \$700 million OTSCIF created in House Bill 33. Status: Effective (6/28/2024)
- House Bill 315 Revise the Township Law Omnibus bill making numerous minor modifications to township law. Due to MORPC advocacy, now includes housing technical assistance funding opportunity for all political subdivisions. Status: Passed by the House (6/26/2024)
- House Bill 536 Seat Belts, Primary Offense Makes failure to wear a seat belt and failure to properly secure a child in an appropriate booster seat or seat belt a primary offense. Status: 3rd Hearing in House Criminal Justice Committee (6/25/2024)
- House Bill 340 Employee Mobility Grant Program Creates a grant for employers in rural counties
 to hire charter transportation services for employees. Status: 3rd Hearing in House Economic &
 Workforce Development Committee (6/18/2024)
- House Bill 79 Permit Electric Distribution Utilities to Establish Energy Efficiency Programs Permits electric distribution utilities to establish voluntary energy efficiency and demand reduction portfolios, subject to approval of the PUCO. Status: Passed by the House (6/26/2024)
- Congress Passes Budget Stopgap, Community Projects On Deck Last month, Congress passed a continuing resolution to keep the federal government open through December 20th, setting the stage for a "lame-duck" budget battle after the November election. MORPC has been monitoring 17 Central Ohio community project funding requests in federal budget legislation, which total more than \$25 million. In cooperation with the Columbus Region Coalition, MORPC continues to support these efforts to drive investment to the region
