***BLEEDING DISORDERS
AWARENESS MONTH
MARCH 2024***

WHEREAS: Inheritable blood and bleeding disorders include hemophilia and von Willebrand's Disease; and

WHEREAS: The symptoms of inheritable blood and bleeding disorders vary from person to person and can include prolonged bleeding, excessive or unexplained bruising, frequent nosebleeds, heavy menstrual cycles, and other symptoms; and

WHEREAS: Volunteers, researchers, caregivers, and medical professionals are working to improve the quality of life for persons and families living with inheritable blood and bleeding disorders; and

WHEREAS: Increased research, education, and support services are needed to find more effective and affordable treatments and to provide access to quality care to those living with these diseases today; and

WHEREAS: Platelets, which are cells that help to stop bleeding by clumping and forming plugs (clots) in blood vessels, are collected when people donate blood and are often used for patients with blood clotting issues or bleeding disorders; and

WHEREAS: To generate awareness on these disorders, four seniors at Gahanna Lincoln High School have initiated the "Savealife.hosa" campaign to educate others on the importance of blood donation, influence people to take the initiative to donate blood, and fund blood centers such as Versiti and The American Red Cross; and

WHEREAS: Through the Savealife.hosa campaign, the group has collected a total of 63 units of blood, which can impact over 189 lives, and is planning to hold a community blood drive in Gahanna on March 8; and


