ACTION ITEMS FROM THE DIRECTOR OF ENGINEERING

<u>ACTION ITEM # 1 – Claycraft Road Fiber Network Expansion – Permission to Bid</u>: Our current fiber-optic infrastructure has grown for economic development, and to provide City services that improve the quality of life and service to our residents. We strategically evaluate our current fiber-optic network for areas where we can improve integrity and redundancy to eliminate our single points of failure and strengthen our network.

This particular project is targeted at improving redundancy of our existing fiber network and improving accessibility of GNet and fiber to the industrial area of the City by installing approximately 4200 liner feet of fiber optic cable and conduit on Claycraft Road between Morrison Road and Taylor Station Road.

The plans for this expansion are nearly complete, so we are respectfully requesting a motion resolution allowing us to formally bid this project once the plans are finalized.
