The OAC convenes grant review panels that evaluate proposals. The OAC board then distributes the funds to communities based on availability and merit.





In the '22-'23 Biennial Budget, the State Legislature gives the Ohio Arts Council more than \$14.4 million per year (\$1.23 per resident).



In the '22-'23 Biennial Budget, the State Legislature gives the Ohio Arts Council more than \$14.4 million per year (\$1.23 per resident).

Starting in 2024, that budget will increase to \$25.8 million (\$2.19 per resident).

(We hope to take advantage of similar funding processes at the regional and federal levels — through Arts Midwest and the National Endowment for the Arts).




