Gahanna Junior League Sports - 2000 Budget

David Ensman, President of GJLS, 597 Codrington Circle, Gahanna presented Council with a copy of Gahanna Junior League Sports 2000 Budget and addressed Council in some concerns that this volunteer organization is experiencing. See EXHIBIT B, which is self-explanatory. In addition to the items referenced, Ensman said they would like to have the resident vs. non-resident fees addressed. Said they play on 9 City fields and 14 school fields. Questioned, in view of the school fields use, that persons in the sport that do not live in the City of Gahanna should be charged more. Said they sign up 1,600

people in 5 days so the addresses are hard to determine at time of sign ups.

Tendered a check to the City in the amount of \$2,900 for past due fees.

O'Brien asked Director of Parks and Recreation Raleigh Mitchell for some response to some of the issues. Hogan questioned more information regarding references to utilities. Clerk requested to give Jordan a copy of the handout. Kneeland asked for clarification on what bill is being referenced to be collected. Stinchcomb expressed concern on fees; questioned losing track of fees, non-resident fees over the last few years? Asked to share with committee further fee information; also what is the policy in other communities. Payne thanked the league adults for donating their hours; said she knows they are not paid; invited them to Development Committee, 7:30, Monday, February 14.

Payne noted the Mayor's audit recommendation. Reminded of the MORPC reception with legislators on Thursday evening at 5:30 p.m.; said local governments have not interacted with legislators, where townships do; townships get what they ask for; sees need for municipalities to be more responsive with legislators; urged members to attend this meeting. Advised first Standards Committee meeting has been set for February 17, 7:00 p.m. O'Brien said regarding the deAlias family and snow removal, has forwarded them Jordan's response; has not heard back anything further. Angelou said the women of Council have been invited to an OSU basketball game.

I. SECOND READING OF ORDINANCES

Ordinances Reported Out of Committee

ORD-0009-2000

TO REZONE CERTAIN 13.7+/- ACRES, MORE OR LESS, AS L-AR, LIMITED

OVERLAY APARTMENT RESIDENTIAL; FOR PROPERTY LOCATED AT 5079 SHAGBARK ROAD; THE STONEHENGE COMPANY, APPLICANT, GLEN DUGGER, ATTORNEY, AGENT.

Director of Development White showed Power Point presentation of the site, noting how far back the property is from Hamilton Road; said will be 100+/- units.; will be condominiums in the \$250,000 range; compared to those built at Jefferson Country Club; said rezoning is to allow for this to go to limited overlay for condominiums or multi-family; limitations that do protect the area is indicated in the text.

O'Brien read from Commissioner Turley's comments at Planning Commission meeting of October 27, 1999. Turley, in noting things that should be considered, stated the following:

" . . . one is relationship of topography to uses; is apparent from road an building layout that there will be buildings on significant slopes exceeding 20%; difficult if not impossible under proposed densities not to impose on the ravine area; ; . . . included in standards are natural features of site, environmental sensitivity, natural features such as unique and fragile areas including wetlands, significant trees or stands of trees, flood plain, steep slopes in excess of 20% and habitats of endangered plant materials or wildlife; also triangle north designates open space along open drainage areas; this plan will promote the removal of natural areas; there is steep topography; can't support this change."

O'Brien continued that Commissioner Mullin did not approve of the road plan in general.

White noted on a visual map the northeast area; said along south and west is a ravine area and the developer is not encroaching in here; asked Council to look at the footprint for multi-family compared to dividing where people would own their lots for homes; said you get far more green space with the multi-family; said they made walkouts. Reminded that they will have to go back to Planning Commission for development plan and design review; can then look at these issues and work them out; felt Turley was more concerned with decks backing onto the ravine. White said we know this developer and the developer's concern to save the environment. Pointed out we are widening Hamilton Road.

A motion was made by Council Member James-Arnold, seconded by Council Member Kneeland, that this matter be Adopted. The motion carried by the following vote:

City Engineer Karl Wetherholt said there has been great concern with Hamilton Road, and we have studied more than we would ordinarily; noted there will be a signal opposite the Vistas; said property would have to be purchased, where there is a house right on top of the roadway; will have to be torn down; no one is living there now; said we have a willing seller; and need the one above it to provide access to the development at that point; anticipates widening to start 2002.

Hogan felt Council did not have information; questioned what happens after the rezoning is in place; asked about the landowner behind, and wondered what was going to happen

there; asked how do you deal with private roads and shared roads. Angelou said it was her understanding that the shared driveway would continue for those people back there and did not believe there is any way for a condo except by AR zoning.

Attorney Glen Dugger, 37 West Broad Street, Columbus, representing the developer, said the City cannot have alienations; said it is not legal to specify ownership; must be specifically about the site; said this zoning has a plan and an entrance landscape plan; said Council is approving that whole property. James-Arnold felt when you top with overlay for multi-family, it is very stringent; likes limited overlay; noted Karrington, which was limited, although the topography is not as cumbersome as Hamilton Road; said the proposed loop road without the loop section; said some of those properties would have to build roads on the east, not Gahanna taxpayers. The loop would need to be done. The other connector over to 62; noted commitments of north and south triangles; said we showed connector roads; this plan works on this; developer has said he would not build more than 25 units before additional ingress and egress is worked on; said there are trees in the area; wetlands would be protected by a governmental body; said they have more to say than we do; noted that everyone wants a slab condo and we are making available to them more choices; so triangle is not becoming one type of condo; said she thinks this project should go forward. Asked when they would expect to break ground. Dugger said it would have to go back to Planning Commission with plan and design; would be worked through Planning Commission; said this takes them well into 3 months; probably late spring; said they are looking at a 2-1/2 year building program. Dugger said one of the things he hears is that Gahanna does not want to get stuck paying for the loop road; called attention to the parcel next door; understands what that road needs to be; said there are 5 parcels; said they would overtake their obligations for the road; feels a great portion would be built privately; is property for the City to own; parcels will be used commercially; back feed them to Stone ridge Plaza; said that is what will happen; will be similar to Route 161 in Dublin.

Stinchcomb said the limited overlay concept was to give Council more assurances that what a developer proposed, they would stick to; had concerns with "the details will come later." Feels in the past we have seen more detail on the rezoning; wants to make sure the original intent of the overlay is followed. Dugger said they wrestled with this application. Stinchcomb said we should have more details; said Dioun has a record here; he will do what he says he will; just wants more detail; would be more comfortable. O'Brien asked for clarification that the ingress and egress will be Shagbark. Dugger said yes--that it will be a boulevard; O'Brien asked if it will be right in, right out. Dugger responded that when they are at 25 units would have to be right in, right out; determined it would not impact Hamilton Road until that time.

Hogan pointed out that whatever is developed will have to be in Gahanna. Angelou, noting the natural topography, said Council has been assured by Dioun and Dugger that there is going to be more open space; said the integrity of the developer is beyond reproach; is an incredibly beautiful piece of property; would have the kind of roads will be less destructive; single family would not work here; has looked at the product; is clearly a right decision for this location; noted condos to the north; felt we will deal with the road issue; believes the loop road will take care of traffic; is a worthwhile project; will support.

Payne felt limited overlay is the best we can do; knowing the developer and Dugger also, they will live up to what they have proposed; is best use of the property. White reminded that if a substantial change under the limited overlay, the developer will have to come back to Planning Commission. Stinchcomb said with less detail, there is less

opportunity to come back. City Attorney Weber said he does not feel Planning Commission could change anything; feels Design Review is the issue; said the footprint cannot change.

Marlene Eader, representing the school board, said she did not have a report as such; said she was late since tonight was the State of the School report meeting; said the students are going through efficiency testing. Hogan said there would be no Council coverage at the board meeting. Kneeland asked if the Board had discussed the building in Jefferson Township and the impact on the schools; had heard possibility of reassigning elementary students; questioned if the Board has communicated this to the township. Eader said they are discussing how to accommodate it, but will check that out. Kneeland said he felt it was forcing the school to do things they do not want to do. Angelou noted the Keyes report of this at the last School Board meeting. Hogan suggested changing the name to "Gahanna City Schools." White advised just meeting with the schools this week; said ironically, our projects add less than 5 children; said the only single family recently is Greens at Clarenton; said all redistricting is attributed to the township; said we do not have enough land to have an impact on the schools.

Kneeland said he would like to look at the Wards for possible redistricting. City Attorney Weber suggested looking at the Year 2000 results after the November election and then look at redistricting the Wards in 2001

Distributed a resolution of support regarding annexation coalition. Said City Attorney has attended the most recent annexation meetings; they have formed a coalition; are asking Gahanna for \$3,000 to assist the coalition.

M. COUNCIL COMMENT

James-Arnold congratulated Development and the Administration and staff for a fabulous Ground Hog Day; was glad to see all the top name developers and Mayors there. Noted the passing of Mary Miller Patton; said she was 102; was born on Mill Street; was the oldest living agent of record with State Automobile Insurance; her father was a past mayor; father owned the mill and blacksmith shop; said she saw 3 different centuries. Thanked the DECA students. With regard to Little League, is looking forward to working with them. Angelou thanked the DECA students. Said clearly Holiday Lights was a success. Said regarding snow removal, heard nothing but wonderful comments on snow removal; complimented the Service department--particularly with all the snow--heard positive comments like never before. Groundhog Day was an incredible presentation; speaker was fabulous; gave congratulations to Development and staff--was an excellent job; said that same evening was the DARE graduation; a very moving event of children and parents; felt we are very fortunate to have officers Tribbie and Nash going into the schools; statistics say that 1.23% of the 4800 in the program have been arrested for DUI. Had an invitation to attend the African Literacy lecture at the high school. O'Brien announced riding with Mike Apple; stopped a couple of vehicles; said it made a believer out of him. Is amazed at how Gahanna has grown; has seen DECA classes take honors; said Russ Cochrane has been the mentor; felt if there were more teachers like Cochrane, and felt is very seldom that we praise people like Cochrane. Said with regard to the vote on Ordinances 200014 and 200015, would like to see more details on limited overlay districts when they come--wants more assurances. Kneeland gave kudos to Development and Service Departments for moving us along electronically. Hogan suggested some plowing on Creekside; also urged people to vote. Stinchcomb said Groundhog was a long day. Stinchcomb said she and Payne had a meeting with the airport with Dave Whitaker; plan to go out in the next two weeks and tour the facilities; they have a device to plot planes; can tell you exactly when and where a plane flies over. Said Debra, Mike, and she attended the police Awards dinner; thanked the department for the invitation. Payne said Dave Thom's son plowed one court and people came out from their homes and cheered; said she is doing Junior Achievement again; did Jefferson Elementary today; is a great experience; also road with Officer Apple; said there are a lot of things you can eyeball. More meetings with the Port Authority.
