MARTIN LUTHER KING Jr. DAY

January 16, 2023


- WHEREAS:** Martin Luther King Jr. Day was established on November 3, 1983, by President Ronald Reagan to celebrate and honor the life and achievements of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., for his efforts in the advancement of civil rights through nonviolent activism; and
- WHEREAS:** A Baptist minister, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. devoted his life to advancing equality, social justice, and opportunity for all, and challenged all Americans to participate in the never-ending work of building a more perfect union; and
- WHEREAS:** The most influential of Black civil rights leaders during the 1960s, Dr. King was instrumental in the passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which outlawed discrimination in public accommodations, facilities, and employment, as well as the Voting Rights Act of 1965; and
- WHEREAS:** Dr. King's teachings are just as important today as they were more than 50 years ago, as they can continue to guide and inspire us in addressing challenges of equality and opportunity for all within our communities; and
- WHEREAS:** Dr. King recognized that everyone can be great because everyone can serve, and during his lifetime encouraged all Americans to serve their neighbors and their communities; and
- WHEREAS:** Each of us can and must contribute to making our communities better with increased opportunity for all our citizens; and
- WHEREAS:** As we observe Dr. King's birthday, the City of Gahanna encourages all Americans to celebrate his memory by performing acts of kindness through service to others in the framework of compassion.
