- Recognized May as ALS Awareness Month in Gahanna to uplift those affected by amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), also known as Lou Gehrig's Disease
- Renewed the School Resource Officer (SRO) contract with Gahanna-Jefferson Public Schools for the 2025–2026 school year
- Approved the 2025 Sidewalk Maintenance Lookback Program
- Adopted new electric vehicle charging station fees as part of our ongoing commitment to sustainability in the community

- Celebrated 25 years of CHLOE, Inc. and honored founder Connie Nafziger's powerful impact on young mothers and families in our community
- Met with Gahanna's new Economic Development Director to support his onboarding and share my vision and priorities for the city's economic growth
- Drafted and sent a letter to state legislatures advocating for fully and fairly funding Ohio's Fair School Funding Plan
- Recognized June as LGBTQ+ Pride Month in Gahanna
- Commemorated Gahanna's inaugural Juneteenth celebration and was honored to receive a commendation from State Representative Beryl Brown Piccolantonio in recognition of the occasion
- Attended a Town Hall hosted by 10TV to hear directly from residents about issues impacting their lives
