M. COUNCIL COMMENT:

Angelou referenced the recent letter to the editor from AEP regarding our right of way legislation; since we have been working on this since 1998, don't understand why this has come as a surprise; was pushed ahead by the Administration who wanted it in place; are at least 5 people that can't come in to provide services because we have to wait so we can recoup our expenses; some of the older utilities like Ameritech aren't used to paying cities; they are now saying we are acting quickly and are trying to hold us up for an amazing amount of time; started as a collaborative effort with MORPC to look at right of way; Harry Gordon, Vice President, AEP, wrote this lengthy letter stating it was amazingly a large surprise; hopefully we will have this reworked legislation soon; no matter how much we bring expenses to line, it will be more than they want to pay; there are two sides to every story; this should not have been a surprise; do believe next week we will have a discussion in Committee of the Whole; these same utilities who wanted to have utility services now want to hold this up; they have had their chance and are now trying to hold it up; shame on you; we are doing what is right for the City and our citizens.

Hogan stated he had been contacted by constituents about the radar speed traps on Granville Street; know we have to stop speeders; concern is that we start ticketing at 36 mph and above; reported to me that an officer speaking to high school students made that same comment; 35 was OK; have one constituent who was ticketed at 29 mph; this is OK if we are going to change our policy; like to see it publicized that we are going to crack down; understand you are speeding at 29 mph but need to make it public in advance; especially since we have had a de facto policy of 35 mph on Granville for quite a while; make it public and they usually will cooperate; have had several phone calls; one person was able to speak with Mularski and since it was only 29 mph in a 25 mph zone he did arrange so she did not have points against her license; do appreciate that cooperation.

Mayor McGregor stated there is no policy; it is officer discretion to write whatever ticket they observe; is a mistake to assume they have a 9 mph clear zone; won't find that in Gahanna.

Payne stated she had attended her first meeting as representative on COTA Board; will be sharing lots of information with you; as a suburban community we don't have it on our radar screen; we are the 17th largest community and the only one that doesn't have a rail system; federal dollars are available; COTA is looking in that direction; will be sharing information on a regular basis; am representing Westerville, Worthington, and Gahanna; want to make sure you have COTA on your radar screen.
