PATRIOT DAY AND NATIONAL DAY OF SERVICE AND REMEMBRANCE

September 11, 2021

- WHEREAS: Twenty years ago, on September 11, 2001, terrorists hijacked four airplanes over the United States, leading to the worst attack ever experienced on American soil;
- WHEREAS: Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance is observed every victims that day; and the emergency personnel who bravely responded and valiantly tried to rescue and children whose lives were mercilessly cut short as a result of the attacks, and September 11 to honor and pay tribute to the nearly 3,000 innocent men, women
