MORPC joined Central Ohio leaders in Washington, D.C. for the Association for Defense Communities conference, meeting with Congressional members to discuss Intergovernmental Service Agreements (IGSAs) and support Whitehall's Defense Community Infrastructure Program grant application. MORPC continues efforts to establish an IGSA with local defense installations to boost efficiency and create local revenue opportunities.

- o Central Ohio Rural Planning Organization (<u>CORPO</u>) <u>Dedicated Funds</u> \$2.4M available for transportation-related projects in CORPO's service area; deadline Aug. 8, 2025.
- o <u>Urban Forestry Grant</u> Up to \$100K for tree planting and urban forestry initiatives; deadline Aug. 27, 2025.
- o <u>FY2025 Disaster Supplemental Grant Program</u> \$1.447B for long-term economic recovery in federally declared disaster counties (2023–2024); *Readiness and Implementation Paths* have rolling deadlines, *Industry Transformation Path* closes Mar. 3, 2026.
