

Economic Development 101 Tools in the Toolbox New Community Authority (NCA)

The New Community Authority ("NCA") program encourages "the orderly development of well planned, diversified, and economically sound new communities."


To form a new community authority, a developer who owns and controls the land must file a petition to create a new community authority district. "New communities" are communities, and additions to existing communities, planned to include industrial, commercial, residential, cultural, educational, or recreational facilities. A new community authority is a corporate and political body, governed by a board of trustees and implements programs to develop a new community characterized by well-balanced and diversified land use patterns.

These programs include land acquisition and land development, the acquisition and maintenance of "community facilities," and the provision of services.¹

Eligible Community Facilities

The community facilities that are developed as part of a new community development program include:

- Public Facilities (town buildings, centers, plazas, or auditoriums)
- Recreation Halls & Facilities (including parks & other open land)
- Educational Facilities
- Healthcare Facilities
- Infrastructure-related facilities (Parking facilities, lighting, water/sewer facilities, energy-related facilities)
