### **UPDATES FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT -**

## 1. Fred Kauser, Fire Chief of Mifflin Township

Fred Kauser, Fire Chief with Mifflin Township Fire Department gave run down of stats for the month; run count was 870; 80% are EMS related; one significant fire in the City in the Olde Gahanna area; went well; freeway incidents are down; 16-18 runs that we used an outside medic; transport rate is about 50%; work with the City on apartment community establishing water supply; addressing that fairly aggressively; they did meet the timeline; City got engaged; Hamilton Road widening project is going on; have been involved in the planning; cannot communicate enough with residents being impacted; will continue to let residents know they will have full access to EMS and Fire services; Kneeland asked how Hamilton Road impacts staffing; Kauser said it will not immediately impact staffing but depending on how it goes they may have to add one or more companies to the south end; have done that before; appreciates that they are included; will now be attending Police Chief meeting and hope to be more involved; ask questions before meetings.

# 2. Cliff Reynolds, Chief with Jefferson Township

Cliff Reynolds, Chief with Jefferson Township Fire Department; said

they are continuing to work on a Comprehensive Plan; the township continues to do car seat inspections and car seat installations for citizens and surrounding citizens; also doing a free movie night for families the 4th Friday of the month; have a fire truck available and they provide drinks and popcorn; Kneeland asked if anything from the Hamilton Road project impacted them at all; Reynolds said only if they assist in mutual aid.

Rich Courter, Trustee, said they are excited to have a backup fire engine as they just got a new engine; excited for a collaborative relationship with the City; thanked the Council for having them.
