CALL TO ORDER

Chair Leeseberg called the meeting to order at 7:38 p.m.

Present 3 - Jamie Leeseberg, Michael Schnetzer, and Ryan P. Jolley

ITEMS FROM THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE

1. 2016 Franklin County Public Health Contract

Franey said each year we enter into contract with them; this year it brings a 5% increase; annual contribution will be \$250,676; asking for an Ordinance authorizing the Mayor to enter into this contract; asking for emergency to be effective by January 1; Kneeland asked if they give us a projected percentage increase; Franey said not a full year, a small notice was given; this is in the 2016 appropriations; said they have been doing a lot of outreach; they have had some major changes.

RECOMMENDATION: Adopt as Emergency, Consent Agenda.

2. Code Modifications - Chapters 921 Sanitary Sewer Rates and 929 Water Connections & Rates

Franey said this is for two pieces of legislation; will modify two parts of the code; Niagara has been incredibly positive for the City of Gahanna; this year we are able to put through a zero increase for water operations; we are able to roll back water capital slightly; sanitary is the complete opposite; have been using our carry-over to buy the rates back; at this point we need to recover; Columbus has given their 2016 increases and they show 4% on water and 3% on sanitary; when we incorporate that, we find our water rates can stay the same and our water capital can be lowered; sewer operational needs to be increased; sewer capital needs increased as well; Columbus consent order, where they are required by the EPA to separate their sewers, they charge us based on impervious area; each year they give the rate for that; \$7.80/eru to \$7.88/eru is the increase; a household is one ERU; other changes involve grammar, cleaning it

up, modifying some wording; Leeseberg asked if the credit is by their tap; Franey said it is for their current tap value at the size; Schnetzer asked if it was charged by the storm; Franey said yes, is based on the impervious areas; a study was done to get the typical square footage of a home in Gahanna, and that is considered an ERU; that is how you come up with how many ERU's a business charge is; Schnetzer asked if they can receive a credit on their stormwater bill; Franey said they can get their stormwater reduced by retaining additional water; just recently talked about those; a gravel area is considered impervious at this point; Leeseberg asked, for residential properties, if they are charged a stormwater fee; Franey said yes; Leeseberg asked if there was a way to get a credit for that; Franey said a resident gets a credit taken away from what they pay quarterly; because the general fund transfers tax dollars into the storm fund, by code; currently they cannot get a credit for a rain-barrel or rain-guard; not saying it will never happen, we are just not at that point now; would encourage people to do it, but will need to be managed, maintained, and verified; Schnetzer said Columbus is increasing their rate they charge us by 4%, asked if they ever gave us a long-run of projection of how they manage their system; Franey said each year they hold a series of public meetings where they go through capital projects and they go through all of that; said we get about 5-6 years of projected rates; said they talk about long-range projects: in the Columbus consent order. they show the full spreadsheets of what they anticipate spending and their amount of funds; Kneeland asked how we will notify residents; Franey said it will go out in the next bill; usually do a news-breach of some sort; will put out information for low-income discounts.

RECOMMENDATION: Consent Agenda.

3. Fleet Program Auction Proceeds Supplemental Appropriation

Franey said this is a standard supplemental; put the proceeds back into the fleet program; will purchase future equipment with the funds; Kneeland asked if this was typical; Franey said it is in terms of the numbers; for police, there were multiple cruisers that were sold.

RECOMMENDATION: Consent Agenda.

4. Insurance Claims Proceeds Supplemental

Franey said this is the same deal; has to do with insurance claims; when it is has been paid, we want to get it back into the expense line; Kneeland asked if we got anything back on the traffic boxes that were destroyed; Ewald said we are negotiating the final lines currently; is around \$149k now; should see that soon.

RECOMMENDATION: Consent Agenda.
