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#### **ACTION ITEM FROM THE CITY ENGINEER**

**ACTION ITEM #1 – Ashmead Drive Street Infiltration Project ST-1031 – Award Contract:** The bid opening for the Ashmead Drive Street Infiltration Project took place on Friday, June 10. This project will implement pervious pavement and underground storage of stormwater to help to further reduce the peak rate of stormwater run-off, improve water quality, and reduce erosion in Souder Ditch. Columbus Asphalt Paving was the lowest responsive and responsible bidder at \$254,133.60. We are requesting a 10% contingency in order to cover any unforeseen construction costs which would bring the total amount to \$279,546.

We are respectfully requesting an ordinance to enter into contract with Columbus Asphalt Paving. Funds for this project were previously encumbered from 2015 Appropriations. (Bid Summary, Contract, and RCA attached)

#### **ACTION ITEM FROM THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC SERVICE**

**ACTION ITEM #1 – Salt Purchase Supplemental Appropriation:** As you may recall, Gahanna's rock salt bid through ODOT required that we purchase 90% of the salt that was in our bid request. Because we didn't need much salt in the last winter season, we ended up with a great deal of extra salt. Gahanna doesn't have a great deal of storage for salt; therefore, we sold approximately 312 tons to the City of New Albany at a price of \$21,485. We would like this revenue put back into our expense account to be used in the coming winter season as we may need to purchase salt depending upon the harshness of the weather.

We are respectfully requesting a supplemental appropriation to transfer this revenue to an expense account as noted in the table below: (RCA attached)

### UPDATE

**Hamilton Rd Central** - The contractor has completed the large retaining wall adjacent to Sycamore Run. Paving of a portion of the new roadway on the southeast side of the project has been completed, and the northwest sections of the widened portions of Hamilton Road are expected to be paved the week of June 25<sup>th</sup>. Once the paving on the northwest section is completed, the western portion and alignment of the northern roundabout will begin to take shape. Crews are also working on setting the light poles, sidewalk install, bike path install, and restoration on the widened portions.

Pavement repairs will continue throughout the construction zone to maintain traffic throughout construction. The contractor hopes to perform a lane switch to move traffic off of the temporary pavement by the first week of July. Private Utility Companies have completed the relocation of their facilities.

Motorists should continue to expect delays throughout the construction zone, and are encouraged to consider other routes if they wish to avoid a possible delay in their travels.
