# 1. Ashmead Drive Street Infiltration Project, ST-1031 – Award Contract

ORD-0069-2016

TO AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT WITH COLUMBUS ASPHALT PAVING FOR THE ASHMEAD DRIVE STREET INFILTRATION PROJECT.

Priestas said we opened bids on Friday, June 10; received 4 bids; Columbus Asphalt Paving was lowest; request an Ordinance to enter into the amount of the bid plus 10%; Leeseberg confirmed were below estimate: Mayor Kneeland said had a conversation about this project: after hearing some of the green initiatives for the MI project; have to make sure we keep our eye on, as we develop these types of projects, some of the unknowns are the long-term maintenance; looked at it as if it were an upside-down bathtub; worry a bit about some of the way water works, especially in this area; the water seepage, is there a risk there and what are the long-term costs; Priestas said this particular project is a pilot project; most cost is covered through a grant; some maintenance costs that seem low; typically we require to check for clogging; after that, will be a 2-3 year maintenance schedule; worst case scenario is the paving lasting only 20 years; there is some long-term maintenance but do not believe it is significant; Mayor Kneeland said also have to be prepared for uptick in costs; Leeseberg said Franklin County put on an all-day seminar last year; Gahanna got a shout-out three times; people are taking note; the industry has gotten so much better; each time you do one, you get better at it; Mayor Kneeland said we do deserve a pat on the back; taking on some unique opportunities; want to make sure we have the

appropriate resources.
