Proposed Regulations submitted by Vallee Wiggins

- 1. All chicken coops must be within 10 (ten) feet of the rear entrance from the owner's house.
- 2. The coop must be no more than seven feet high, by four feet in depth and eight feet long.
- 3. The coop must be constructed of either wood or plastic and must be maintained by the owner. This would include mandatory painting with a solid color either white or the color of the home at least once every two years.
- 4. The length of the coop (the eight foot) must be parallel to the house, so as not to extend out into the yard.
- 5. The run must be attached to the length of the coop and must not exceed more than four feet in height, four feet in depth, and eight feet in length.
- 6. The coop may not be any closer house than sixty feet from the nearest neighbor's house..
- 7. When the owner no longer has chickens, the coop must be dismantled and removed from the property within one month.
- 8. The coop may not be moved to alternate locations so that the smell of the manure with stay where the original coop is placed.
- 9. The chickens may not be allowed to run freely outside of the coop or the run at any time, even if the owner's property is fenced.
- 10. The number of chickens may not exceed more than three for a property of less than or equal to one half acre.
- 11. No roosters are permitted.
- 12. Loose chickens may be killed by neighbors without penalty from the city.
- 13. Failure to abide by the above regulations will result in a \$100.00 fine for the first offense, \$500.00 for the second and removal of the chickens and the coop and run at the owner's expense. A failure will occur after a one week notice from the city that the ordinance has been broken.
