### Wii Bowling League




For the third year in a row the Gahanna Senior Center Wii Bowling League

# Supervisor's Note



In 2018, the Gahanna Senior Center membership enjoyed another great year. We experienced growth among the membership as well as several facility and program enhancements. The following is a brief snapshot of just some of our

accomplishments this past year:

- Membership grew to over 540 members, including 160 firsttimers.
- Over 16,500 membership visits (not including public rentals and other community meetings conducted at the Center).
- · Senior Golf League grew to over 80 golfers age 55+!
- We conducted our inaugural "Scramble FORE Seniors" golf fundraiser in August 2018. The event was a huge success raising \$4,000 and was our highest netting fundraiser to date.
- Our Center along with GLHS's Theatre Appreciation class won 2nd place in OPRA's (Ohio Parks & Recreation Association) category for Historical and Cultural Arts. The program, "All of Us: A Life Project" is part of our ongoing program "Project Interact", which is a partnership between our Senior Centerand Gahanna-Jefferson School District.
- We started a direct mail campaign to all members of our "Senior Spotlight". This has been a huge success and is printed at no cost to our Center due to sponsorship ads.
- We completed several facility & program enhancements: replaced kitchen cabinets and appliances; enhanced outdoor courtyard including commercial grade benches & picnic tables with shade umbrellas; added safe concrete walkways at rear entrance; installed outdoor floral hanging baskets and planters through efforts of our Garden Club; acquired new tables for our card groups and table tennis league; and acquired new touch screen kiosk monitor for membership check-in.

It would be impossible to highlight all the great things we experienced together in 2018, but just know we are grateful for another year of memories with each of you. To commemorate our fantastic year together, we have dedicated our centerfold to a collage of memories. Thank you for making our Senior Center a great place for the senior community to gather.
