

Proclamation

NATIONAL BLACK BUSINESS MONTH

August 2020

- WHEREAS: National Black Business Month was founded in 2004 by John William Templeton and Frederick E. Jordan, Sr., to recognize the important role of African-American businesses throughout the country and to encourage their continued development;
- WHEREAS: encouraging people to support their businesses is key to reducing barriers for Black-owned businesses, and "could result in more than 40,000 additional jobs Templeton and Jordan thought that highlighting Black entrepreneurs and course of a year;" and during the month and as many as 450,000 if the patterns are continued over the

- WHEREAS: The number of Black-owned businesses – and those owned by women – continue to grow, as the number of firms owned by Black women grew 164% from 2007 to 2018, nearly three times the average rate;
- WHEREAS: Supporting and promoting Black-owned businesses helps to close the racial wealth gap, and encourages the flourishing of the local community and culture;
- WHEREAS: Gahanna is home to hundreds of Black-owned businesses that provide familysupporting jobs and careers to residents, and these businesses are a vital and proud component of our diverse community.
