C. HEARING OF VISITORS.

Rob Sanders, 2625 Darling Road, Blacklick, Ohio, 43004; feels the pre-annexation agreement is a done deal before public has had a chance to give input; curious about tax increment financing; item 7 creating a new community authority not to exceed \$7 mil; how much money is that expected to be; it's a total of 10 home sites; that amount seems questionable on 10 homes; money is to be used as the city wishes; not necessarily on this development; people who buy these homes aren't going to be real happy; can add land or parcels at anytime is questionable; how long will this new community authority last; question the agreement; most of the document is straight forward; doesn't feel great about how the process works.

Jeannie Hoffman, 708 Waybaugh Drive, Gahanna, shared thoughts on city attorney position from part-time to full-time; four cities have elected city attorney; Gahanna and Whitehall have full-time; Columbus has huge law staff; Westerville has no city attorney; contract out all; big difference in job description; Ewald said he worked 52 hours a week at the committee; tend to think that is very high; and is new anomaly and plenty of times that it requires less hours; records request said this is a part-time position, said the hours are not kept now; spent over \$300,000; changing position will have negative impact for future candidates; outside counsel will not decrease; come with a full-time salary request at end of his term; this request should be no rush and should have more thought.

Community Improvement Corporation (CIC) - Renner/Larick

Larick said we meet tomorrow morning at 7:30 a.m. in City Hall.

Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) - Angelou

Angelou said met last Thursday; Resolution to file application to receive funds from ODOT passed unanimously; Murdock to make visits this summer; Insite 2050 expect new figures and metrics to come; more than expected in the five years have been added to our region; will reach \$500K by 2025; means growth could reach 1 million dollars by 2050; to be largest metro area in Ohio; spent 56% outside the urban corridor; growth has been 25 square miles in-fill area; project will take 112 square miles of farm land; projected less; protects our farm land and food sources; positive for the area; 62% has multi-family; fits the 2050 insite model; Glenn Marzluf spoke about new Del-Co Water Conservation Tier; creating new charge plan which attempts to conserve water use in warmer months; gave an update on Smart City; one of seven finalists; grant of \$40 million; Department of Energy is adding another \$13 million, potentially; and other private additions; large in-scope grant, fingers crossed; opinion page article has an article about the Smart City Challenge and their efforts; vision is to be the city's development and implementation; based on pillars, smart logistics, connected citizens, sustainability transportation; connected visitors; spend 5.7 billion dollars each year; 8.7 billion dollars in this area and jobs; see Columbus just by looking at these items; Columbus should be selected; is the 15th largest; leading in the state; fastest growing metro area; top for job and wage growth; third best city for millennials by Money Magazine; 2015, selected as most intelligent community in the world; international center for innovation; largest with non-profit region; green leader; has state-of-the-art facilities; Columbus has held AAA bond rating with Moody's since 1995; committed a 20% match of funds; implementing the \$46.8 million from transit authority; smart city board bipartisan community support; MORPC passed Resolution supporting this opportunity for Columbus; a lot taking place in Easton area; great for our community; all things at Rickenbacker will bring us a win; winner announced at the end of June; City Council passed on the same letter of support; Secretary Fox is here today to see how things are going; hopes he sees Columbus as the face of the future; Kerstin Carr said 5th bike map is in the office; in clerk's office; can get boxes of maps for community; age-friendly Columbus has kicked off; senior tsunami; first year of a 2-year project to gather data; commuter challenge starting June 1; visit makeyourmilesmatter.com; win prizes to select alternate options to get to work besides driving; several important transportation resolutions that passed; core programs will receive fed funds; update

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every 4 years; metro transportation plan; long range \$19.6 billion in transportation plan; award \$10 million to Columbus to be housed in this building; round table legal update; state has been busy doing half year's work in 7 weeks; \$100 million in Clean Ohio Fund; supported by MORPC; capital fund shows where funds are going; on MORPC's website; all information is in the Council office; Senate Bill 320, 2019; does make energy policy changes; it encourages market based incentives; send 528 license plates; annual fee template to support funding; allow our city to add \$15 charge that would go for roads; Senate Bill 235 model is important; trying to defeat this bill; 2017-2018 be passed in November; October 21st feeding our economy.

Bd. of Education, Gahanna-Jefferson Public Schools - Metzbower

Metzbower said had meet and greet with Steve Barrett, new superintendent; great presentation by two students from DECA club; HS club teaching them finance; two young ladies to encourage students to go to college; blown away with how great they presented; great to see young minds and great work; 530 new graduates from Gahanna; this is pre-cursor; must pass test; crossing fingers all make it; discussion about presenting a letter on charter schools; funds not going into public schools; discussed the strategy on that issue.

Convention & Visitors Bureau (CVB) - Leeseberg

Leeseberg said CVB working on new wedding brochures to attract visitors to the area; July 22nd is next CTA meeting; mark calendar; need volunteers for Creekside Blues & Jazz Festival; kayaking and canoeing fly-fishing demonstration; craft beers Friday and wine tasting on Saturday; come early and come often; is reserved seating but seats are filling up fast; provides jobs for the community; important to support them; please call; June 26th at 4 p.m. is board meeting.

Mayor

Mayor sent Council port authority; can forward; quick overview; Columbia Gas \$35 million investment; working on 25 projects for potential of 1,400 jobs; Capital Investment \$51 million; number of different use cases will send report out Friday; 4 pending offers to Council in next few weeks; visited over 56; 10 more already scheduled; making big dent in business community.

City Attorney

Ewald said appreciates the passed moratorium; working close with Planning Commission to work on that; start preparing for Planning Commission; 145-day window, expect to have code back in 30 to 45 days.
