A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF FUNDS - Sewer Fund to Sewer Capital Fund; and General Fund to Council Office Insurance Benefits

WHEREAS, the Department of Engineering identified available funds in the amount of \$39,000 within the Sewer Fund professional services to support the Olde Gahanna Sanitary Sewer project within the Sewer Capital Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Finance has completed a salary and benefit projection to year end based on staffing changes, actual hire dates, and changes in insurance selections since initial appropriations were passed and has identified \$25,000 necessary to provide for Council Office insurance benefits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GAHANNA, COUNTY OF FRANKLIN, STATE OF OHIO:
